We know that we will all have to face some kind of suffering, and so we try to prepare ourselves for it. Yet when it comes, as prepared as we try to be, it can overtake us with such fury that we fall back defenceless. We look to others for support and assistance, and if we are fortunate, we find it. However, even in the most supportive of communities, suffering tends to alienate us from those who are healthy and secure. Suffering reminds us of our own finitude and the contingent nature of all of life. It threatens our sense of order.



Jesus is not deterred by human suffering. He welcomes all who approach him; his healing touch reincorporates those who have been ostracised; his loving embrace reassociates those who have been alienated. In the reign of God, there are no outsiders. All belong to Jesus, and, therefore, all belong to each other. When the one afflicted is embraced by the community, the community is an authentic manifestation of the inclusive reign of God.

In suffering we witness human vulnerability and our desperate need of each other and of God. There, at the edge of life and on the fringes of the community, we may experience the tenderness and compassion of God. The loving touch of Christ that can heal our souls, if not our bodies. It is there that we may most authentically participate in the cross of Christ. Joined to him we are anything but unproductive or worthless.

Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday, 17 February, marks the beginning of the Lenten Season.

Due to COVID-19, the Congregation of Divine Worship has advised that we will sprinkle ashes on the heads of the faithful instead of the traditional marking on the forehead this year. The parishes in the Archdiocese of Brisbane will follow this recommendation in keeping everyone COVID-safe.

Mass times are 6.30am, 9am & 7pm.

We ask that you book for Ash Wednesday Mass. Please go online to <u>www.carinacatholicparish.org.au</u>

and click on the "Ash Wednesday Mass Bookings" image. If you do not have internet access, call the parish during office hours on 3398 2977 to make a booking.



Mass Bookings will close at the following times:

- 6.30am Mass Tuesday, 3.30pm
- 9.00am Mass Wednesday, 8.00am
- 7.00pm Mass Wednesday, 3.30pm

Those already on the weekday contact tracing list at 6.30am or 9am Mass will not need to book in if they are attending their regular Mass (example: if you are on the 6.30am Mass list and will be attending 6.30am Mass on Ash Wednesday, you will not need to book).

Ash Wednesday is a day of fast and abstinence. The law of fasting binds those who have completed their eighteenth year, until the beginning of their sixtieth year; the law of abstinence binds those who have completed their fourteenth year (*CCL 97, 1251-52*)

To make it as easy as possible, contact tracing details will be collected at the door for those who attend Stations of the Cross.

Parish Finance Council Update

Over the last 12 months your Parish Finance Council has arranged the sizable roof repairs to the Church that many of you would have noticed. This then included some upgrades to the main entry. During this work we had a safety incident that, when investigated, lead to the emergency replacement of the power switchboard and a full electrical audit of the Church and Office building as well as the Dominican residence. Needless to say, we are happy to confirm that both the roof repairs and the electrical system has been corrected albeit expensive.

During the pandemic and the real limitations of Mass attendance, events and general fellowship, we have seen a major reduction in revenue and to this end certain expenses have been reduced or activities placed on hold. The Planned Giving has also seen sizable reductions. However, I wish to thank everyone that have continued to support the Parish over a difficult year.

In recent months you may have used the votive candles. These have been well received and continue to do well. In the near future we will be adding an EFTPOS machine within the office to ease the payment process for our parishioners and the staff.

We would welcome new ideas and new faces on our team. You are more than welcome to have a chat with Fr Alex and you're very welcome to attend our next meeting in April.
