

Israel believed that the temple was built over the navel of the universe, the axis mundi, that spot where the world above and the world below met the world of thus enabling the three worlds communicate. When Jesus called himself the new temple, he was claiming to be the centre of the universe, the spot where three-way cosmic communication occurs, the presence of God in the midst of the community. When we accept him in faith, we are accepting these claims. We may profess this belief, but do our lives reflect it?



Although some consider the law a rigid set of precepts, it is really more a collection of directives that have grown out of the experience of life. To say that Jesus is the wisdom of God means that God's wisdom is made known in him and that he is the way that points to God. While laws often embody distinctive cultural values or customs, as wisdom of God, Jesus crosses cultural boundaries and breaks down cultural distinctions. As the wisdom of God. Jesus fulfils the expectations of any and all codes of law.

Both the law and the temple witness to the power of God in the lives of believers. However, both institutions pale in the light of Jesus who is identified as the power of God. Working Bee



Sacred Paschal Triduum Timetable 2021

Given the current restrictions we still have to abide by under the COVID Industry Safe Plan for Places of Worship, the Sacred Paschal Triduum Timetable for 2021 will be different from the times of before COVID. Similar to our Christmas Masses last year, some parts of the Sacred Paschal Triduum liturgy will need to be held in the Dominic Centre. This is because the Dominic Centre can accommodate more people than in Our Lady of Graces Church.

Due to the restricted numbers, we ask parishioners to be considerate of others when making their selections on the parts of the Triduum liturgy they wish to attend.

9am Easter Sunday Mass - Dominic Centre *Note: NO Evening Mass on Easter Sunday*
