Reflection by Dianne Bergant CSA

Today we consider the presence of the Risen Lord. Where is he found? Each of the readings offers an answer to this question. The Risen Christ is found in the community of believers who follow the example of Jesus. Even non-believers recognised something marvellously different about the Christian community, and they exclaimed: These Christians, see how they love one another.



The Risen Christ is found in those who accept the truth of the resurrection on the word of others. The word of God preached by others has often brought us out of darkness into light, from the stranglehold of death to the birth of new life. The preaching of the disciples has been not only instructive, it has also been transformative.

The Risen Christ is found in the forgiveness of sin. Jesus made the frightened disciples ministers of divine forgiveness. The Spirit reconciles sinners with God and, thereby, with the rest of the believing community. Forgiveness is a tangible sign of Christ's mystical presence.

The Risen Christ is found in the physical manifestation of Christ's own wounds, the wounds that he offered to be touched. Since the community is the body of Christ, we touch the wounds of Christ when we touch the wounds of the community, when we go out to the sick and infirm, the dispossessed and the violated. As shocking as these wounds may appear, they are really glorious, because the Risen Lord has identified with them and has made them his own.



COVID Reminders

With the Greater Brisbane lockdown that ended on Thursday 1 April, please keep in mind that the outbreak is not over and some restrictions remain in place across all of Queensland. These include the following.

- Until Thursday 15 April, at this stage, all Queenslanders must carry a mask when they leave their homes. Masks are to be worn in indoor spaces and worn outdoors when social distancing is not possible.
- Please remain socially distanced as much as possible when queuing at the entry, when receiving Communion, and when leaving.

Mystagogia, Neophytes and Other Mysteries In many parishes new members were initiated into the Church at the Easter ceremonies.

This period following the celebration of the sacraments at the Easter Vigil is the time when the newly initiated reflect on their experience of the rituals, explore the meaning of initiation and come to a fuller understanding of the mysteries of the faith

With the help of their godparents, they should experience a joyful welcome into the community. It is the role of every member of the parish, not just the RCIA committee, to encourage these new members and to help incorporate them more fully into the community. Support for these new Catholics is vital as they settle into the pattern of living their newly professed faith and learn to recognise the mystery of Christ which is so alive within them.

This post-Easter period of the RCIA journey is known as the "Period of Post-baptismal Catechesis" or "Mystagogia". It is a time for the community and the "neophytes" (the title used to refer to the newly initiated during the Easter Season) together to deepen their grasp of the paschal mystery and in make it part of their lives through mediation on the Gospel, sharing in the Eucharist, and doing works of charity.

To make new members feel welcome and included, every effort should be made to have the neophytes and newly received present at Sunday Mass each week during Easter Time.

The newly initiated should be included in the General Intercessions on each of the seven Sundays following, up to and including Pentecost. They can begin to take on some roles in the liturgy.

In a sense, Christians spend their entire lives in mystagogy as they reflect on what it means to live in Christ. Let us pray for the neophytes, and for ourselves, that we may come to see Christ more clearly, to follow him more nearly and love him more dearly day by day during this season of Easter.

First Reading: 3:13-15. 17-19 You have killed the prince of life; God, however, raised him from the dead.


Second Reading: 1 John 2:1-5 Jesus Christ is the sacrifice that takes away our sins
