The community of Our Lady of Graces acknowledges the Traditional Custodians of the land on which our parish stands.

Our Lady of Graces (Feast Day: 9 June)

The Mother of God is revered under many titles. As Our Lady of Graces she is honoured in various parts of the world. That title also appealed to the first priest at Carina, Fr David Lewis a Dominican from Ireland, in seeking a patroness for the new parish in 1952. He was influenced by devotion in his home country and particularly at the Dominican church of St Mary's at Pope's Quay, Cork. That church has a famous shrine (as pictured here) on the Rosary Altar. The story of the Irish shrine makes interesting reading.

The Story of the Shrine

This little ivory Image of Our Lady of Graces is one of the few images of Our Lady that have survived in Ireland since before the Protestant Reformation.

There is a legendary account of its origin. Like all legends it expresses a truth. The truth that the Image is a heaven-sent gift. In historical fact it was brought to Ireland from Europe in 1304 by the Archbishop of Cashel, Maurice O'Carroll. When he died is 1316, the Image, for which he had a special veneration, was buried with him in the Dominican Church in Youghal Co.



For over one hundred years the Image lay buried and forgotten. Then, at a time when religion had fallen to a very low level, Our Lady herself intervened. She appeared in a dream to one of the Dominican Community of Youghal and asked that the Image be dug out from the tomb. The revival of fervour and the growth of devotion which followed that recovery is indicated by the changing of the title of the Dominican Church in Youghal to that of "Our Lady of Graces". The Image became the focus of fervour, a centre of pilgrimage, an occasion of grace.

When the Dominican Church in Youghal was destroyed in the reign of Queen Elizabeth I the Image was saved from destruction by a daughter of James Fitzmaurice Fitzgerald. She had it enclosed in the silver reliquary in which it is still encased. Through violence, persecution and poverty, the Image of Our Lady of Graces somehow survived. A report to the Dominican Master General in 1629 states, "devotion to Our Lady of Youghal is everyday rewarded by miracles and wonders. So great is the devotion, so wonderful and so frequent the miracles that the Image is popularly called "Our Lady of Graces and Miracles".

When the Dominicans were finally forced to abandon Youghal at the end of the eighteenth century the Image was brought to Cork. After so many vicissitudes, and hallowed by such devotion, it now rests on the Rosary Altar in St Mary's, Pope's Quay, Cork, where it was placed in 1895.

Jesus said the Kingdom of God is like a mustard seed which grows into a great tree. Our faith must be like that.





Missionaries take on 'smell of the cattle' (Published by CathNews on 7 June 2021)

When Pope Francis encouraged priests to "take on the smell of the sheep" by being with the people, he might not have imagined two Divine Word Missionaries would respond by spending time on cattle stations in Queensland.

Fr Truc Quoc Phan SVD and Fr Yon Wiryono SVD are based in Emerald, in Queensland's central highlands region, which is part of the Rockhampton Diocese, but they care for four churches at Emerald, Springsure, Blackwater and the Aboriginal community of Woorabinda as well as some smaller communities.



And rather than stay put in their churches, which are situated hundreds of kilometres apart, they have both been spending time with their parishioners, many of whom live on the land outside the townships.

"It is part of our desire to be with the people, not only at church, but in their daily lives," says Fr Truc. "When we go and spend time with them where they are it builds up relationship and it tightens the bond between us and them."

One of the two priests heads out to Springsure every third week to say Mass on Sunday and to stay through the week.

"We have spent time on cattle properties and we also visit people in the countryside before and after Mass," Fr Truc says.

He says there are plans to make more regular visits to the Aboriginal community of Woorabinda.


