Reflection by Dianne Bergant CSA

In the gospel, Jesus reaches deep into the world beyond life and rescues a young girl from the jaws of death. Earlier, he was jostled by the crowd and felt healing power leave him in order to restore an afflicted woman. Repeating the words of last week's gospel: Who is this man? Is this someone with whom we want to become involved? On the other hand, can we afford not to get involved with him? This is a man who can lead us to life even in the midst of death. He is someone who is interested in the well-being of everyone, even those



who may not be highly valued by society – women and children, the chronically ill, those who carry the seeds of death within them.

God's graciousness toward us should prompt us to be generous toward others. What we receive as life-enhancing gifts, we must share with those in need, those to whom life has not been kind. As we have been favoured by the healing touch of God, so we must extend that same loving touch to others. The love of Christ impels us to be openhanded as we approach those in need. Following Jesus' lead, we must not only give to them, we must also allow them to take from us. At times this will require that we share material resources; at other times it might mean that our energy will be drained in our service of them. In all of this, Jesus has set the example for us to follow.

Changes for Contact Tracing at Our Lady of Graces

The Queensland Government announced on Sunday 20 June that <u>from 1am</u> <u>Friday 9 July, the Check In QLD app will be required for Places of Worship</u>.

Over the next couple of weeks, we are introducing the following changes:

- With the increased capacity limit of 375 people, we are in a position that we do not require you to book for Sunday Mass each week. Next weekend, 3-4 July, will be the last weekend that we will use Eventbrite for regular Sunday Mass bookings. However, Eventbrite will still need to be used on special occasions (e.g. First Holy Communion Masses).
- Everyone, who is able to, is asked to start using the Check In QLD app. Please ensure that your Frequent Guests list is up-to-date with family members and friends details listed. If you are checking-in family members and/or friends, you need to select them from your Frequent Guests list after you have scanned or typed in the code. Please show the tick sign to the person responsible for checking people in (i.e. the Marshal/s at Mass). Check-in is required each time you visit the parish.
- For those who do not have a smart phone or who find the technology difficult, we are currently awaiting clarity from the Archdiocese and Government on the correct way to check you in. For the moment, please check-in with the Marshal at Mass. There will be an update next week.

The Peter's Pence Collection will be taken up as a retiring (leaving) collection across the Archdiocese at all Masses next weekend (3-4 July).

The collection allows the Holy Father to respond to the most needy throughout the world, to offer timely, effective emergency assistance.

Safeguarding News: New Laws Targeting Sexual Offences Against Children

The Government has introduced new laws that target behaviour which ignores or conceals child sexual abuse. The new laws mean that <u>all</u> adults in Queensland now have a legal duty to:

- report sexual offending against children by other adults to the police; and
- protect children from the risk of sexual abuse by other adults in an institution (e.g. a school, church or sporting club).

The laws <u>commence on 5 July 2021</u> and carry up to 5 years imprisonment. For more information go to <u>https://www.qld.gov.au/law/crime-and-police/types-of-crime/sexual-offences-against-children/laws</u>

COVID-19 Update & Changes

Changes that came effective as of last Friday, 25 June 2021, 1am.

- Capacity restrictions have increased to 3 people per 4 square metres. This means that we can have up to 375 people in the church.
- Physical distancing is to be observed to the extent possible. This means that people should try to distance as much as they can while adhering to the current occupancy restriction of 3 people per 4 square metres.
- The restriction on self-service food has been removed. People may make their own cup of tea or coffee and plates of food can be set out on the table for people to help themselves at morning teas or gatherings after Masses. Please ensure that people are able to take a food or drink item without coming into contact with other items or shared utensils.

Effective of Friday 9 July

• The Check In QLD app is required for Places of Worship, Funerals & Weddings. Please refer to the front page of Spread the Word.

What has <u>not</u> changed?

 Cleaning protocols, Sign of Peace without physical contact, The Body of Christ administered only in the hand, the chalice received by the celebrant alone, and collections being contactless (i.e. no passing a plate from person to person).

Reconciliation Action Plan

The Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP) is a guide for all agencies and parishes to build respective relationships with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples to



gain an understanding and appreciation of the effects of racism (systemic and casual); to acknowledge historical impacts of colonialisation on contemporary Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples; and identify opportunities to build new pathways.

There are four types of RAP - Reflect, Innovate, Stretch or Elevate. The Archdiocese of Brisbane's RAP is an Innovate RAP, which is about implementing reconciliation. It focuses on developing and strengthening relationships with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, engaging staff and stakeholders in reconciliation, and developing and piloting innovative strategies to empower Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

St Vincent de Paul – Our Lady of Graces Conference

It has again been a very busy six months for the Conference members of St Vincent de Paul. Since January the Conference has undertaken a range of activities to assist those in need within our local Community –

- Back to School payments for up to 90 children costing \$30,000 (financed via an internal grant from St Vincent de Paul, State Office and the Whitehouse Foundation).
- Providing emergency food assistance and food vouchers (\$15,000) to those in need in the local community (supported by financial and in-kind food donations from Parish Members, St Martin's Primary School and San Sisto Community College)
- Providing fresh produce weekly to families with school-aged children to ensure children have access to nutritional meals and fruit for lunch boxes (financed by the Lord Mayor's Community trust grant).
- Providing end-of-day bread to families and individuals in need weekly known as the "Bread run" (supported by the Flour Monkey Bakery and The Bread Corner).
- Purchasing second hand whitegoods for families moving to the area and often escaping domestic violence.
- Purchasing second hand furniture for families moving to the area and often escaping domestic violence.
- Providing Go Cards to men recently released from Jail to ensure they can attend necessary appointments and job interviews.
- Assisting with rental payments to families and individuals impacted by job loss from COVID.
- Providing clothing Vinnies gift cards and warm winter beanies and blankets (kindly donated by Parish members).
- Advocating and assisting families with department of housing matters, child safety concerns and mental health areas.
- Assisting with budgeting and financial management in particular with energy bills.
- Attending on-going training (provided by State Office St Vincent de Paul).
- Attending "expert panel" sessions to provide an insight to the work undertaken by St Vincent de Paul at Our Lady of Graces.

In all of these activities our central focus is the person we are assisting, providing them with a hand up not a hand out, offering outreach and support for the person to feel empowered to make decisions for themselves and their family. As Conference members we undertake activities in a non-judging and dignified manner and remember to see Christ in all those who we visit. Thank you for your ongoing support.
