Jesus chose disciples to continue his work; he instructed them and empowered them. He sent them out on a mission, and they returned. People followed them, because they wanted to hear what Jesus and the disciples had to say; they wanted to be released from the sickness and the demons that possessed them.



There are so many searching people in the world today, people hungering for instruction, good people looking for direction. They may be parents who are sick with grief over the future of a troubled child; a man stripped

of his dignity through unemployment; a woman facing a pregnancy alone; elderly people feeling the surge of life leave their declining bodies; people who are angry and confused because they believe that the church is no longer dependable. They are people who are looking for answers and for meaning. They are like sheep without a shepherd, and Jesus looks to us to shepherd them.

In the midst of this confusion, there are reliable shepherds who walk with us in the dark valleys. They are willing to share the dangers through which we pass, even at the risk of their own safety. They do not pit one segment of the community or one theological perspective against another, scattering the sheep and driving them away. Instead, they work to dismantle the walls that divide us. They speak the word that gathers us together. They reconcile us with God and with each other. They may not give us easy answers, but their primary concern is to lead us to Jesus, the one who is our peace.

COVID-19 Update on Restrictions

Restrictions until Saturday 24 July, 6.00am (subject to change)

- Capacity restrictions will remain at 1 people per 4 square metres. This means that we can have up to 125 people in the church.
- You must wear a mask in indoors spaces, including places of worship.

Please keep in mind that if you are sick or experiencing any symptoms, get a COVID test and quarantine at home until you receive a negative result.

What has <u>not</u> changed?

• Cleaning protocols, Sign of Peace without physical contact, The Body of Christ administered only in the hand, the chalice received by the celebrant alone, and collections being contactless (i.e. no passing a plate from person to person).

No Regular Sunday Mass Bookings

With the Check In QLD app now <u>mandatory</u> for Places of Worship and that everyone needs to be checked-in via the Check In QLD app, there will no longer be bookings through Eventbrite or the Parish Office for our regular Sunday Masses. Eventbrite will only be used on special occasions, at this stage. This is because of the double handling between bookings and the Check In QLD app for our Marshals. It is more important that everyone is entered in via the Check In QLD app for contact tracing purposes.

Therefore it is first come, first in, up until the capacity limit, for coming to Mass. If you want to ensure you have a seat, please arrive early for Sunday Mass. This is particularly important if you are rostered on for a ministry at Mass.

NAIDOC Week Celebration Mass

Last Sunday, 11 July, at the 9am Mass, the Parish celebrated NAIDOC week. Present at this Mass were Ravina Waldrenn (Murri Ministry Coordinator), Marlon Riley (First Nations guest), Aunty Judy Brown and Aunty Iris Smith.

The Mass began with an Acknowledgment of Country and paying tribute to the traditional owners of the land. The playing of clap sticks accompanied the Entrance Procession.

At the time of the Penitential Act, Marlon Riley led an ancient Aboriginal custom of a smoking ceremony and he explained to the congregation the meaning and significance of such a custom. A smoking ceremony involves the smouldering of various native plants to produce smoke. This herbal smoke is believed to have cleansing properties and the ability to ward off bad spirits. Marlon proceeded to allow everyone in the congregation the opportunity to be 'blessed' by the sacred smoke by gathering it to themselves as he brought it close to each person.

At the end of Mass, Fr Alex blessed the NATSICC (National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council) Acknowledgement Plaques. The NATSICC Plaques features the Parish Logo as well as the School Crests of St Martin's Primary School and San Sisto College. The Parish plaque has been fixed to the outside of the church. The principals of St Martin's Primary School, Mr Andrew Oberthur, and San Sisto College, Mrs Shelley Hamilton, were present to receive their blessed plaque that they have taken back to their school.

A second plaque, blessed at the end of Mass, is seen as you exit the church and it reads:

Before you take another step, remember the Aboriginal Peoples that first walked this land.

With this plaque hangs above an Aboriginal cross made and painted locally by Aboriginal artist David Riley.

The Parish Social Justice Committee thanks everyone who was involved with bringing this special Mass together.

The Check In QLD app is now <u>mandatory</u> for Places of Worship. Everyone needs to be checked-in via the Check In QLD app.

Therefore, we ask of the following:

- Everyone, who is able to, is to use the Check In QLD app on their phone.
- If you are checking-in family members and/or friends on the app, you need to select "Check in additional people" and either select them from your Frequent Guests list or tap to enter the guest's name.
- Once you have completed your check-in, please show the tick sign to the person responsible for checking
 people in (i.e. the Marshal at Mass). Check-in is required each time you visit the parish.
- For those who do not have a smart phone or who find the technology difficult, please either check-in with the Marshal at Mass or ask someone with a smart phone to check you in on their phone as a guest.

If you need assistance with the app, please see the parish office staff or a marshal.
