Reflection by Dianne Bergant CSA

One major theme emerges from today's readings: incomprehensibility of God. We see it in the mysterious divine name, which distinguishes the God of Israel from all others and yet leaves us in the dark as to its meaning. We see it as God communicates with us through inanimate objects and the people in our lives. Finally, we see that God both pardons iniquities and decides to root out unfruitful branches, and we are confused by such inconsistency.

In the midst of this ambiguity we have one sure source of stability — Christ. It is Christ who reveals the nature and meaning of the divine name; it is Christ who intercedes for us before God. Christ, the one who set his face toward Jerusalem, there to suffer and die, is the great messenger through whom God is revealed. He is the one who reveals majesty through the simplicity of a bush; he is the one who judges with the patience of a gardener. However, the limits of the experience and mercy of God in our lives are defined by our own openness. Despite the blessings that we receive in the wildernesses of our lives, it could happen that God is not pleased with us. We must not take God's goodness for granted.

These readings close on a note of caution. Take care! We might be able to rest secure in the knowledge of the love and mercy of God, but these readings tell us that we should not dare to rest passively or complacently.

The Scrutinies

The Scrutinies are being held for the Elect preparing for the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Communion at Easter during the Saturday 6.00pm these next three weekends, the 3rd, 4th and 5th Sundays of Lent.

The Scrutinies are rites that confer strength and healing, and confront all the faithful with the need for conversion. The readings of Year A are used when the Scrutinies are celebrated, even in Year B or C. The Gospel from John, which have been used for centuries in baptismal preparation, are filled with images of thirst and water, darkness and light, death and life. These readings have major importance in regards to Christian Initiation.

Therefore the Saturday 6.00pm Mass are hearing the Year A readings these next three weekends, while the remaining Sunday Masses are hearing the Year C readings.

Stations of the Cross is being held at 7.00pm on each Friday evening during Lent.

An Explanation of the Stations of the Cross

After Emperor Constantine lifted the ban on Christianity in 313, visits to the Holy Land became popular. Pilgrims seeked to follow the path of Jesus, especially of his last days in Jerusalem. Thus developed the way of the cross or Stations of the Cross. When pilgrim Christians returned to their homelands telling stories about the wonders of Jerusalem and the spiritual benefits, others wanted to join in but could not afford such pilgrimages. Hence a mini pilgrimage or parallel devotion entailed the setting up of images to represent the events and places of Jesus' passion. The first record of "Stations of the Cross" is from the 5th century, at the church of San Sefano in Bologna, Italy. The practise of praying the stations was made popular by the Franciscan Order in the late Middle Ages. However, it was not until the 18th century that the number and subject of the stations were settled on. The traditional stations were a blend of scriptural and legendary material. In 1975 the Congregation for Sacred Rites suggested a new list of 14 stations which is more scripturally based and gives a fuller picture of the events of the paschal mystery. It begins with the Last Supper and ends with the Resurrection. Although the stations focus on the suffering of Jesus, they must also acknowledge our belief that the cross is a symbol of victory, not defeat. Visit a church this Lent and make your own pilgrimage around the stations. Invite an Elect to join you.

Our Lenten Liturgical Environment Symbols

Below is an explanation of our Lenten Symbols:

- The Violet Material in front of the Altar is in colour of the season. The way the material has been placed in front of the Altar represents the flowing of water, which is a symbol of Baptism and Easter.
- The Autumn Leaves acknowledge the change of season in our part of the world.
- The Ashes come from the blessed palms from Palm Sunday the previous year. They represent that we are but ashes and shall return to dust.

As most parishioners are aware, we had water damage following the 'rain bomb' over Brisbane in late February. Due to the amount of rain, this caused the rain to come in from different directions including through the roof and walls. It must be noted that we only repaired the four corner sections of the Church roof back in 2020, which was the most urgent repair work to be done at the time.

This week the machines drying the floor have done their job, with the level of dryness now low enough for the machines to be taken away.

Now we wait for the next stage in the process. We ask for your paitence, especially with the timeframe for new flooring. The process may be a slow one.


