



Martha and Mary are often seen as symbols for a balance of hospitality. Martha represents the tasks of preparation – cleaning the house, cooking, setting the table, and the like. Mary represents the personal care of the visitor – listening, paying attention, spending quality time in conversation. Both are important.





If you were invited to someone's home for dinner and the gourmet meal was so complicated that you were completely ignored until dinner was on the table, how would you feel?


Some people are the 'perfect blend' of the Martha–Mary examples of hospitality, but others fall off to one side or the other, being more talkers than housekeepers, or being more housekeepers than talkers.

When you have people around, do you tend to be more of a talker or more of a housekeeper? Or do you think you have a good balance, having all the preparations done ahead of time so that the focus of your attention is your guest?

Do you know anyone who has a perfect balance?

Scriptural context to today's Gospel

It is no accident that this story about Martha and Mary immediately follows the parable of the Good Samaritan. We must remember that Jesus is portrayed as telling that parable as clarification of the law to love God and love neighbour. The Samaritan provides an example of what it means to love one's neighbour whilst in this story, Mary provides an example of what it means to love God. Together, the two stories tell us that compassionate service to one's neighbour is crucial but that God does not require service, simply love.

Sr Helen Rankin OP - Rest in Peace

Helen (Sr Mary Stephen) was born in Sandgate, Queensland on the 14 November 1925 to Donald and Ruby Rankin. The youngest of five children, Helen completed her secondary schooling as a boarder at Santa Sabina in Strathfield, Sydney. Helen then entered the Dominican Community in 1945, so had been a Religious Sister for 77 years!

Initially Helen trained as a primary and infants teacher. Her ministry took her to all sorts of places from Hobart to Newcastle, Maitland, Bathurst, Portsea, Canberra and Moss Vale as well as Brisbane (1972-1979; 1987-1988; 1991; 1998-2010). Helen's sense of adventure was recognised when she was asked to be part of the first band of missioners from Australia to the Solomon Islands in 1956. In between times she worked on the Bowral Refugee Project with young Vietnamese men, helped out at a Pensione run by Irish Dominican Sisters in Rome, taught English for a few years in Kirchheim, Germany, and did parish work in Nhulunbuy in the Northern Territory.

Helen was particularly attached to the Dominicans and the Parishioners at Our Lady of Graces Parish in Carina, where she spent her final years in ministry visiting the people and doing what she could for the friars and anyone who needed help. The Carina community – priests, parishioners, primary and high schools - provided the 'home' she loved.

Although Helen did not want to believe it, in 2010 Helen's health was not the best and she was asked to move to a supported living Dominican Community in Maitland. Helen lived there missing her Brisbane friends intensely, but becoming increasingly frail, till she became a resident at St. Joseph's Nursing

Brisbane friends intensely, but becoming increasingly frail, till she became a resident at St Joseph's Nursing Home Sandgate, Newcastle. After some months of struggle, Helen died peacefully there on 9 July 2022.

Helen is sadly missed by her Sisters, her family and her many friends. Her funeral mass will take place when the Maitland floods subside. Helen will continue to work for us from heaven. No doubt she will look for extra special favours for those in Carina parish! Please pray to Helen and for Helen as we mark the end of a long life lived with the interests of the people of God always close to her heart.

May she be blessed by God and intercede for us all.
