Spread the Word

5th Sunday of Lent

The community of Our Lady of Graces acknowledges the Traditional Custodians of the land on which our parish stands.

Reflection by Greg Sunter

The third, fourth and fifth Sundays of Lent in Year A feature significant passages from the gospel of John. The first of the three readings was the story of the Samaritan woman at the well, to whom Jesus described himself as Living Water. The second was the healing of the blind man and Jesus declaring himself to be the Light of the World. In today's passage about the death and raising of Lazarus, Jesus declares, 'I am the resurrection and the life.' Living Water; Light of the World; and the Resurrection and the Life - three



important images of Jesus that all emerge from the gospel of John. Each of the events relate to Jesus' response to some physical need: thirst; blindness; and death. However, in each case, Jesus not only responds to the physical need but also reveals a truth about himself that leads people to belief.

The raising of Lazarus marks a turning point in the gospel of John. Chapter 11 concludes with the Jewish authorities plotting to arrest Jesus and then Chapter 12 begins the final week of Jesus' life in Jerusalem. The significance of this episode is highlighted by the disciples who question Jesus about the wisdom of going back to Judea when the people there had wanted to stone Jesus to death. In going to save the life of his friend, Lazarus, Jesus knows that he is journeying towards his own death. In fact, the end of Chapter 11 makes clear that it is some of the witnesses to the raising of Lazarus who go and complain to the authorities and precipitate the action against Jesus. In the gospel of John, it is the episode with Lazarus that effectively signs Jesus' death warrant. The gospel makes clear that Jesus gives up his own life so that Lazarus may live.

Sacrament of Reconciliation

- By contacting the parish office to make an appointment

For those unable to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation prior to the Triduum, the only opportunity during the Triduum for the Sacrament will be on Good Friday after Stations of the Cross.

Below is an extract of an article which appeared in the 1st April 1973 edition of The Catholic Leader.

Carina church 'a great building'

Archbishop O'Donnell told a gathering of Carina parishioners last Sunday that their new church was one of the great building of the Archdiocese of Brisbane.

He was speaking there after the blessing and official opening of the new Church of Our Lady of Graces and St Martin.

The new complex consisting of a church and priory, both linked by a covered passage, was built by F.C. Upton and Sons at a cost of \$350,000. Architects were A. Ian Ferrier and Associates.

Archbishop O'Donnell said the completion of the project was a tribute to the patience and perseverance of the priests and people of the parish who had made do with temporary buildings for more than 20 years.

The new church was well built, would need little maintenance, and fulfilled the latest requirements of the liturgy.

Archbishop O'Donnell said he could recall the humble origins of the parish and how his predecessor Archbishop Duhig had foreseen the development in the area.

He had purchased about 10 acres of land on what was then the outskirts of the city, and his foresight has proved correct.

Archbishop O'Donnell congratulated the former pastor, the present parish priest and Carina parishioners on the achievement.
