This is 'Good Shepherd Sunday' and a particular focus taken today leadership. Which voices do we follow? Why do we follow these voices and not others? Authentic leadership is rooted in authority, and authentic authority is the ability to author or bring life to birth. Genuine authority cherishes, guards and encourages the best in life; it provides rest and refreshment; it guides our steps; it nourishes us; it leads us to God. Peter is an example of authentic authority: he proclaims the truth, even if others find it hard to hear: he denounces error, even when this places him in jeopardy; he calls for a change of heart, even when it makes great demands.



Authentic leadership is patterned after the leadership of Jesus. It is gentle and familiar, like the true shepherd; it has won the confidence of those who follow, as did the true shepherd; it is committed to the enhancement of the lives of others, as was Jesus. Authentic leadership is willing to forgo its own needs and to deny its own interests in favour of the needs and interests of others.

Heavy demands are placed on those who follow authentic leadership. Those who follow the Good Shepherd must follow him in the dark valleys as well as to the refreshing streams. They must be willing to relinquish some of their own plans and self-determination and entrust themselves to his leadership. They must never forget that they are following a shepherd who has paid the ultimate price on their behalf.

Teach Your Children to Use GPS

After Mass today, have a conversation with your children, asking, "What do you want to be when you grow up?" After a few moments of discussion, ask, "Who do you think God wants you to be when you grow up?" Emphasise to your children that God has a specific plan in mind for them, and that following God's plan is the surest way to happiness. Every life decision - which college to attend, whom to date, which job to pursue, whether to enter seminary, whom to marry - should be undertaken only after praying for God's guidance. In other words, encourage kids to navigate life using GPS - God's Positioning System.

Holy Communion from the Chalice

Parishes are allowed to reintroduce the reception of communion from the Chalice. It is emphasised, however, that if you are unwell that you refrain from receiving from the chalice or receiving communion on the tongue.

Invitation to be a Minister of Communion

With the reintroduction of Holy Communion from the Chalice, this has meant an increase in the number of Ministers of Communion across our Masses.

For example, at our Sunday Masses we now require 6 Ministers of Communion including the priest/s.

So as to not overburden those currently on the roster, this in an invitation for anyone to become a Minister of Communion at Sunday Mass.

If you feel interested in being part of this ministry as a Minister of Communion at Mass and are currently not on the roster, please call or email the parish office with your expression of interest and contact details.

A training session will then be organised in the near future for new Ministers of Communion. An updated Ministers of Communion roster will also be re-issued, reflecting the new Ministers who have come on-board.

Priority Three: Bringing Cultural Communities to the Centre

"The face of the Church around the world is changing as the centre of gravity shifts from places like Europe and North America (and Australia) to Africa, Asia and Latin America...

Certainly in the Archdiocese the presence of people who have come from overseas – from Vietnam, the Philippines, the Pacific islands, India, Sri Lanka, Latin America, Africa – is growing stronger...

These large and growing communities have gifts for the whole Church, and increasingly the centre of gravity in the Church here is moving in their direction. Therefore, they have to be brought more to centre-stage in the life and mission of the Archdiocese, since much of the real spiritual energy in the Church here is found among them.

This again will involve significant cultural change for the whole Church in this part of the world."
