

### Reflection by Greg Sunter

The gospel readings for this week and next week shift the focus away from resurrection and begin to set us up for the departure of Jesus from the earth - the Ascension and the sending of the Holy Spirit – the Pentecost event.



Today's gospel passage comes from the very long Last Supper discourse in the gospel of John. When Jesus speaks about 'going away' for a time it could be interpreted as the period of his death and rising that are about to occur in the chronology of the story. However, the gospel of John is written a very long time after the death of Jesus; perhaps as much as 70 years after Jesus. Given this period of time between the events and the writing, we know that the writer was also referring to this longer time of Jesus 'going away'. By the time of the writing of this gospel the early Christians were starting to come to terms with the fact that Jesus probably wasn't going to return in their lifetime. They had seen the devastating destruction of Jerusalem and the Temple by the Romans in 70CE which they thought had signalled the end of all time. However, here they were, still alive and still no sign of Jesus' return.

The theme of being present and being absent is very strong in this gospel. The discussion about Jesus and the Father being one is part of this theme. Jesus is God present in the world. God has come to dwell among the people. When Jesus speaks of preparing rooms in the Father's house, it is a reference to preparing the disciples to 'live' in God; to dwell in God just as God has dwelt in the people.

Lamps Ablaze: Apostolic Priorities for the Archdiocese of Brisbane

#### Priority Four: Responding to Abuse and the Abused

"In responding to abuse and the abused, we need to move beyond considerations of law and finance... Of course we need to attend to legal and financial matters, but the paramount concern needs to be the good of those abused. Not all victims and survivors look to the Church for spiritual and pastoral accompaniment and care, but some do and others may in time, if ever trust can be established. We can learn from experience elsewhere in seeking to respond more effectively to abuse and the abused. Unless we do, this will remain a gaping wound – certainly for victims and survivors but for the whole Church as well – which makes it hard for us to move in the future."

May is the month of Mary: May is traditionally dedicated in a special way to honouring and seeking the intercession of Mary as the Mother of God and Mother of the Church.

"She is that woman who rejoiced in the presence of God, who treasured everything in her heart, and who let herself be pierced by the sword. Mary is the saint among the saints, blessed above all others. She teaches us the way of holiness and she walks ever at our side. She does not let us remain fallen and at times she takes us into her arms without judging us." - Pope Francis, Gaudete et Exsultate, no. 176

As the Mother of God, the Virgin Mary has a unique position among the saints, indeed, among all creatures. She is exalted, yet still one of us. Why does Mary have such a prominent place in the communion of saints? As Benedict XVI reflected in *Deus Caritas Est (Dec. 2005)*, "Outstanding among the saints is Mary, Mother of the Lord and mirror of all holiness. Mary's greatness consists in the fact that she wants to magnify God, not herself. She is lowly: her only desire is to be the handmaid of the Lord (cf. Lk 1:38, 48)."



Mary, more than anyone, can show us Jesus, lead us to him and teach us to know and love him, "so that we too can become capable of true love and be fountains of living water in the midst of a thirsting world."

#### From the Parish Social Justice Committee: Domestic Violence Prevention Month

The month of May is not only the month of Mary – it is Domestic Violence Prevention Month – and how appropriate. Mary is the advocate of all mothers and children – as should we also be.

The statistics on the right hand are very disturbing. Domestic violence is a big problem in this country and we all have a responsibility to do something about it. The Australian Catholic Bishops Conference Social Justice Statement 2022-23 Respect: Confronting Violence and Abuse highlights this importance of this issue and our role as Catholics is to be proactive in making a difference.



Respect: Confronting Violence and Abuse points out that the roots of domestic and family violence "lie in the abuse of power to control and dominate others" and that "this stands in contrast to the relationships to which God calls us". #### How can you help?

- Call out any disrespectful behaviour towards women and girls (even jokes).
- Encourage gender equality in the treatment of both young girls and boys.
- Do not judge. People of all ages, socio economic backgrounds and genders, are victims of domestic violence. Violent partners are often very manipulative, controlling and threatening and women are trapped in these relationships making escaping extremely difficult.
- Show compassion and empathy.
- If someone discloses to you that they are in a violent relationship or you become aware of the fact don't just tell them to leave. If they feel unsafe at home, support them in seeking help from one of the organisations listed below. Note that when women or men leave violent relationships, it is then that they are most at risk of being killed by their partner.
- If you or anyone you know is experiencing any forms of abuse emotional, psychological, physical or sexual seek help by calling one of the phone numbers below.
- Do not ignore the signs if you hear or see something you believe to be abuse please call the police and get help – it could mean the difference between life and death.
