The Most Holy Trinity

The community of Our Lady of Graces acknowledges the Traditional Custodians of the land on which our parish stands.

The readings for this feast do not directly explain the doctrine of the Trinity as we have come to know it. Rather, they offer us glimpses into the nature of our Triune God. The psalm response suggests that our primary response to God should be one of praise for the love that God has for us.


The God who is beyond our comprehension is also the God who has saved us. We see this theme in both the first reading and the gospel. The covenant language in the reading from Exodus



underscores God's unfathomable goodness. God's graciousness and mercy are not rewards for our fidelity. They are extended to us in our sinfulness. It is God's saving grace that transforms us, not any merit on our part. In the gospel we are assured that Jesus was sent into the world to save it, not to condemn it.

The Trinitarian phrase found in the letter to the Corinthians is so expressive of the love that God has for us that it has been incorporated regularly into the liturgy. It declares that through his death and resurrection, Jesus has opened for us the treasury of divine grace. It also proclaims that the love of God has forged the bonds of community that unite us. Created in the image and after the likeness of this God, we are called to unity among ourselves. As incomprehensible as it may seem, it is primarily through the unity that we share that we will manifest the unity that exists in God.

Living the Gospel - Sign of the Cross Every time we bless ourselves or begin prayer with the sign of the cross, we reaffirm our belief in the Trinity. That seemingly simple prayer, 'In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit,' is, in fact, a confirmation of our belief in a triune God - three in one. The earliest use of the sign of the cross only involved tracing a small cross with the thumb or finger on the forehead as it is still done in baptisms or blessings today. Later, describing the shape of the cross on forehead, abdomen and shoulders became the common practice.



Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament

Calvary preparing for legal action against ACT Government

Calvary is ready to take legal action against the ACT Government over its proposed acquisition of Calvary Public Hospital, stating the "unrealistic timeline" has distressed staff and could put patients at risk.

In a statement released yesterday, Calvary said a legal challenge was the only response left available if the debate on the bill was not adjourned to make room for genuine discourse.

The Health Infrastructure Enabling Bill is expected to pass today, allowing the Government to compulsorily acquire the hospital from July 3.

Calvary has been frustrated by the ACT Government's refusal to consider any meaningful options to resolve negotiations since the introduction of the bill on May 11.

"Our review of the proposed legislation and associated regulation indicates that just terms are simply not available and outside of this there is no indication that commercial terms are available to resolve this matter," Calvary national chief executive Martin Bowles said.

"All we have is an announcement and an imposed unrealistic timeline that has distressed our people and could ultimately put clinical safety at risk."

The proposed legislation was created for the ACT Government to compulsorily acquire the whole of Calvary's public hospital enterprise, including its land, the public hospital assets and other rights that Calvary has under the existing lease and Network Agreements.

The head of the Save Calvary taskforce, Fr Tony Percy, said the issue was bigger than Calvary.

"What's at stake here is not the Labor Party, not the Catholic Church, but the rights of ordinary citizens to have proper land and property rights," he said.

"Over 33,000 people have signed the Save Calvary Petition – however, it seems, we have yet to be heard." Extract on an article by the Catholic Voice, published 31 May 2023


