Reflection by Greg Sunter

This week's gospel must be read in conjunction with the first reading (Isaiah 5:1-7) and the responsorial psalm, because the message of these passages is implicit in the parab le told by Jesus. As soon as Jesus began to describe the vineyard - fenced around, a winepress dug and tower built - his audience would have immediately known that he was reflecting the Isaiah description of Israel as the vineyard of the Lord. Isaiah's condemnation of Israel in that passage is so strong that one can almost Jesus' audience cringing imagine in anticipation of where this story was leading.



The imagery Jesus used would have been so familiar to his audience that it was almost mundane, and yet Jesus, as usual, gives the image a twist. He describes a vineyard owner whose tenant farmers rebel, beat and murder his servants. Any one of these acts was punishable by death and the audience may well have expected the story to end there. And yet the landowner sends further messengers – hopeful of a change of heart from the tenants and allowing them the opportunity to do what is right. After these messengers are also murdered, the landowner sends his own son to collect the harvest from the tenants.

Jesus, of course, is drawing on the familiar image of Israel as the vineyard of the Lord. God, the landowner, has entrusted this beautifully prepared land to the people of Israel and yet they have taken ownership for themselves and forgotten their Lord. Messengers, in the form of prophets, have been sent to call the people back to God but they were ignored and even murdered. Now, the Son has been sent to the people and received much the same response. When Jesus asks his audience of chief priests and elders what the landowner should do, they are acutely aware that he is asking them how God should deal with them.

Maintenance Update

Church Skylights

The removal of the Perspex in the Church Skylights will be completed this coming week. Thank you for your patience and understanding will this important safety work has occurred.

With the removal of the Perspex, there is currently no diffuser to reduce the amount of light and glare coming through the Skylights. This is particularly noticeable with the harsh afternoon sun. Please note that when the entire roof is replaced, in the near future, the plan is to include diffusers on the Skylights. For the time being, just take into consideration where you sit in the Church. Particularly for early morning and evening Masses.

Removal of the Leopard Wood Trees

The Leopard Wood Trees located to the left of the Church, behind the Statue of Our Lady, will be removed over the coming months. Two of these trees will be removed on Tuesday 24 October. This has come about for a number of reasons including:

- The seed pods causing a safety hazard when laying on the concrete. We have had a few parishioners with near misses of slipping
- The leaves are causing regular clearing of the gutters, which is an expensive cost each time.
- The roots of the trees have caused damage to the wall and pathway below the location.

Please note that we will be replacing the Leopard Wood Trees with mature Waterhousea Trees, which are more suitable. An example of these Waterhousea Trees are on the corner of the Dominic Centre near the OSHC entrance.

Safeguarding News

The Archdiocese of Brisbane has recently released a revised Volunteers Matrix. The maxtrix now comprises of only 28 volunteer roles and no longer includes some "low risk" volunteer roles such as Readers and Special Ministers of Communion at Mass. For those people who are only in these roles, you do not have any safeguarding accreditation requirements. The reason for this is that you are not working or engaging directly with either children or adults-at-risk while in these roles, as the role is publicly during Mass in front of the Priest and the congregation, and therefore in such a way that does not provide an opportunity for abuse.

For those volunteers who are only in these "low risk" roles: You may have received an email recently from Blue Card Services that your Blue Card was "de-linked" from the Archdiocese of Brisbane. This action does not necessarily cancel your Blue Card. It just means we no longer require your Blue Card to be registered with the parish (Archdiocese of Brisbane) as your volunteer role/s no longer require a Blue Card.

For those volunteers who either engage directly with children or adults-at-risk, or who are in a coordinator/leadership role / handle money / have keys to the Parish: The Parish Office Staff will advise you when your safeguarding accreditiation requirements are due for renewal and assist you with the process. This includes a Blue Card / Police Check (every 3 years), a Prior Conduct Declaration form (every 3 years), Safe Conduct Standards form (once-off) and Safeguarding Training (every 2 years).
