Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

The community of Our Lady of Graces acknowledges the Traditional Custodians of the land on which our parish stands.

Reflection by Greg Sunter

This week's gospel is the final passage in Matthew's gospel before the passion narrative – the death and resurrection of Jesus. As such, it provides a powerful end point to the teaching ministry section of the gospel. In many ways this passage can be seen as a summary of Jesus' vision for the Kingdom – a world in which the hungry, the thirsty, the stranger, the naked and the imprisoned are treated with respect and dignity as a child of God. This is exactly what Jesus himself did throughout his ministry and it is what all Christian people are called to do.



Like the virtuous people of the passage, there are many times when we do not know the good work that we do. There are many times when our positive interaction with another person can be the difference between hope and despair for that person — and we may never know the difference we have made in their life. The challenge presented by Jesus is that whenever we see a person in need our response to them should be as if we were responding to Jesus himself.

But what of the times we fail to respond to the hungry, the thirsty, the stranger, the naked and the imprisoned? Who are they for us? ... That irritating person who we've never been able to get along with? ... That person who's just arrived in the country and can't speak the language properly? ... That kid who always looks dirty and nobody talks to? ... That girl who's no good at relating to other people and everyone avoids her? ... The homeless man in the street who asks for money? ... The asylum seeker fleeing their country who didn't go through all the right channels to immigrate? ... Lord, when did we see you, and not come to your help?

St Vincent de Paul Meeting



Silence hides Violence!

In the fast approaching season of Advent, where we hear the cries of John the Baptist, *Prepare the way of the Lord! Make a straight path for our God!*, we might also be more attentive to the cries of the poor and abused amongst us.

Daily, it seems, our news feeds report yet another woman being killed or injured by an intimate partner or ex-partner. For each of these, there are many more which go unreported or unacknowledged as many women and children suffer in silence and fear, in their own homes. The parish Social Justice Committee is working to raise awareness and offer support for those in our own community who might be in this predicament.

Queensland Churches Together Commission for Prevention of Domestic and Family abuse has prepared resources to assist churches to raise awareness of the plight of many families who experience abuse behind closed doors. for further information go to https://www.qct.org.au/resources-links/domestic-family-violence-resources

Consider the 5 Ds of Bystander intervention.

- **Distract:** Take initiative to indirectly confront and de-escalate the situation.
- Delegate: Seek out a person of authority to intervene.
- Document: If possible (safe), document the incident (filming on your phone). Be sure to include the time, date and location in the recording.
- **Direct:** If safe, address the perpetrator directly and ask them to stop.
- Delay: If safe, talk to the victim after the incident is over.

Maintenance Update

Waterhousea Trees

Last Monday, 20 November, two Waterhousea Trees were planted in place of the Leopard Wood Trees that were removed a month ago from behind the Statue of Our Lady.

Church Skylights

In the next couple of weeks, prior to Christmas, we should have the new Polycarbonate Sheeting installed in the Church Skylights. This sheeting will replace the Perspex that was removed a couple of months ago and therefore reduce the amount of light and heat currently coming through the skylights. The colour selected for the sheeting throughout all four skylights is Grey Tint, which to the eye looks more of a Blue colour. This is the middle option in the samples that have been above the main door of the Church the last few weeks. At the same time of the sheeting being installed, the yellow panels in the atrium of the skylights will be painted white. This will complement the Grey Tint sheeting that will be installed.

However to allow for this work to be completed, the Church itself will have to be closed. We do not have a start date yet, but it will be sometime in early December at this stage.

When this work is being done, the 6.30am & 9.00am Weekday Masses, as well as Prayer / Devotional Groups will be held in the Parish Library. Some groups that meet in the Parish Library may have to be relocated to the Aquinas Room.

Weekend Masses will still be able to be held in the Church at this stage.

We also won't be able to accommodate any Funerals while the Church is closed.
