## Reflection by Nick Brodie

Advent is a season best lived in a wakeful way. Pope Francis has characterised it as a continuous call to hope: it reminds us that God is present in history.' Every year we prepare for Christ's final return by preparing to celebrate his birth, all while reminding ourselves that he is already present.
This season is therefore a time in which every Christian is called 'to listen to the Lord who knocks', as the Pope put it. Jesus is knocking already; it is we who need to
 wake from our slumber and spring into action. The Church isn't a waiting room. We need to do more than sit and wait. While a season of expectation, Advent is also an annual reminder that the Christian adventure is already underway! Which is what being 'on guard' really means. It is not a negative sort of guardedness, closed off from the world. Rather, the gist of Jesus' message is about readiness, preparedness, awareness. As Pope Francis says, this means we should strive to avoid being 'overwhelmed by distraction or superficiality'. Admittedly, there is much to be distracted by at this time of year. Yet, in the end life is not measured by Christmas presents but by being truly present. As the Pope says, Jesus wants each one of us to be a person who 'lives in a full and conscious way, with concern first and foremost for others.'

## Have you thought? Beginning Advent

The season of Advent begins this week and continues through the four Sundays of Advent and ends at Christmas Eve. The first week of Advent focuses on the return of the Lord and the following weeks focus more specifically on the anticipation of the birth of Jesus. Rather than simply commemorating an historical event, Advent is a time of preparing our hearts to 'receive' Jesus into the world each year. Advent is traditionally marked by the colour of violet - the same colour as used in Lent. In recent years, some parishes have moved to a more blue/mauve colour for Advent to try to distinguish it from the season of Lent.

IMPORTANT NOTICE
Work on the Church Skylights
Work on the Church Skylights will commence, at this stage, on Wednesday 6 December.
As explained in Spread the Word last weekend, the work on the Church Skylights will involve the installation of the new Polycarbonate Sheeting to reduce the amount of light and heat currently coming through the skylights. The colour selected for the sheeting throughout all four skylights is Grey Tint, which to the eye looks more of a Blue colour. This is the middle option in the samples that have been above the main door of the Church the last few weeks. In addition, the yellow panels in the atrium of the skylights will be painted white. It is expected that this work will take at least one week and a half to complete. Please note the following changes below.

6.30am \& 9am Masses, as well as Prayer / Devotional Groups, will be held in the Parish Library.
- Saturday \& Sunday (9 \& 10 December) Masses will be held in the Church, as per usual.
- Monday-Friday (11-15 December)
6.30am \& 9am Masses, as well as Prayer / Devotional Groups, will be held in the Parish Library. The only exception is NO Rosary or Novena after 9.00am Mass on Wednesday 13 December due to Advent Adventures.

We will not be able to accommodate any Funerals while these repairs take place.
