

## **Reflection by Greg Sunter**

The feast of Pentecost celebrates the power of the Holy Spirit coming upon the disciples and energising them to set about their mission of continuing the ministry of Jesus. The gospel reading is one of the post-resurrection appearances by Jesus when he breathed the Holy Spirit upon the disciples. The actual events of that first Pentecost are recorded in the book of Acts and are recalled in this week's first reading. The use of this post-resurrection gospel account is a reminder that Jesus had already imbued the disciples with the Spirit but, as so often throughout his ministry, they were a bit slow to catch on to the significance of what he had done. It seems that they needed a more tangible experience to jolt them into action and Acts records the very physical experience of the Spirit entering their midst as a roaring wind before settling upon them as tongues of flame. Jesus had breathed the Spirit upon them but it took the roaring wind to make a real impression on the disciples. There are frequent references in the gospels to Jesus being 'filled with the Spirit'. It is this Spirit with which he was filled that he breathed upon his disciples; it is that same Spirit that we receive sacramentally in Confirmation.



For the weeks following the death of Jesus the disciples had lived in fear and confusion, not fully understanding what had happened and not really knowing what to do. When they realised that the Spirit Jesus had breathed upon them was really present and urging them to action they finally had the courage to begin the mission that Jesus had entrusted to them: to spread the Good News of Jesus and continue to realise his message in the world.

Prudent financial management requires the parish budget if possible to be in surplus or at the very least balanced.

Since our last successful campaign in 2014 contributions to the planned giving program have dropped markedly. Is now time to renew our previous commitment. We ask also that members of our parish family who have not previously participated commit to join the program.

We would also ask you to consider making your contribution through a direct debit or credit card, by doing so the parish can more effectively manage its finances. However if you prefer to contribute via the weekly planned giving envelopes that too will be fine.

## **The Sequence of Pentecost**

*What is it we are doing this weekend after the second reading?*

It may come as a surprise to some that the poetic, or meditative hymn known as the *Sequence* is obligatory in our liturgy on two occasions in the year – Easter Sunday and Pentecost. The words of the Sequence focus on the feast, and were intended to embellish the Gospel acclamation. Look out for it, and join in with gusto this weekend!

## **New Feast - Our Lady, Mother of the Church**

About the new feast:

A new memorial has been introduced to the General Roman Calendar: the commemoration of Mary, Mother of the Church. It will be celebrated not on a fixed date but on the Monday after Pentecost Sunday using texts which are already in the Missal under Votive Masses (see page 1411). There is a proper Preface.

The Second Vatican Council insisted that its treatment of the Virgin Mary should be placed within its document on the Church, giving our theology of Mary a profound ecclesiological significance. Placing the new memorial beside the feast of Pentecost recalls the presence of Mary with the apostles in Pentecost day and her motherly care of the new-born Church. The commemoration further reminds us that by water and the Spirit we are part of the Body of Christ whose Mother is Mary.

Celebrating Mary, Mother of the Church helpfully shifts the focus away from the many titles and celebrations encompassed by popular piety which seem more particular and individualistic. Instead our veneration of Mary is placed in the broader context of the mystery of Christ and the Church.

The night saw us raise just under \$6000 which will go towards BED Scripture groups, Alpha programs, Social Justice and more.
