Reflection by Greg Sunter



The feast of the Body and Blood of Christ celebrates the central celebration of Christianity – the Eucharist. All three readings relate to this Eucharistic theme. In the second reading, we have the first written account of the Last Supper and what came to be seen as Jesus instigating the Eucharist. Paul's account, written well before the gospels, was entrenched in the tradition by the time the gospels of

Matthew, Mark and Luke echoed these words of Jesus at the Last Supper. Of course, it is these same words that are spoken by the priest at the consecration in the Eucharistic Prayer each Mass. The words used today are the very same words that have been used in the Church for two millennia.

Rather than a gospel account of the Last Supper to celebrate the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, we are presented with what is widely regarded as another 'Eucharistic' story from the gospel of Luke. The feeding of the five thousand with five loaves and two fish is regarded as a Eucharistic story because it was a clear example of God's presence in a miraculous meal. All of the meal stories in the gospel of Luke are instructive for the audience. Whenever the gospel writer refers to a meal, the meal is used to teach about the reign of God. The gospel writer uses meals to demonstrate who is welcome in the reign of God. Like in today's gospel, the author of Luke's gospel was keen to show that the reign of God is available to anyone who wishes to be a part of it. The reign of God is inclusive and welcoming; no one will be turned away.

Finance Matters

This is the first of a series of notes that will appear in the coming weeks providing feedback on Planned Giving matters. A new Planned Giving Continuation Committee has been formed by the Parish Finance Council (PFC) as a small group whose aim is the maintenance of the Parish's Planned Giving program.

First, thanks and appreciation from Fr Alex, the Parish community and the PFC to those who have honoured their pledge over these past twelve months. Your contributions to the Parish finances ensure the important ministries of Our Lady of Graces continue.

However, it is concerning that the collections reported each month have been steadily declining and worryingly, are not meeting Budget expectations. This message therefore is to encourage all who have made pledges to review their contributing practices. We know that times are difficult for all, but no less so for the Parish.

If perhaps you have fallen behind we encourage you to either:

- Examine your circumstances and return to contributing the amount pledged in June last year (If you cannot remember your pledged amount please call the Finance Officer on Monday, Wednesday or Thursday)
- b) Ask the Parish Office for a new pledge form and notify the amount that you believe you will be able to honour.

Having this information helps the PFC in its decision-making and the provision of funds for our ministries.

A final message for this week. The payment of pledges by Direct Debit is encouraged, especially as contributions come in a more consistent order allowing for better financial planning. Direct Debit is easier for you too - no need to chase money each week and it saves the counting team tallying, recording and banking each Monday.
