Reflection by Dianne Bergant CSA

The readings for today engage us in a reflection on the nature of the Trinity, as well as the ways that we are enriched by each of the divine Persons. The gospel acknowledges the sovereignty of God. This is followed immediately by mention of the handing over of all things to Jesus, making him a kind of vice-regent of God. Paul speaks of the Spirit, clearly a divine reality, but different from Jesus and the one called God. According to Paul, this



Spirit is the Spirit of Jesus and the Spirit of God, implying that somehow both Jesus and God claim the Spirit. It is this Spirit who raised Jesus from the dead, and it is this same Spirit who dwells in Christians.

The grace of this Triune God touches our lives in some ways that are tangible and other ways that demand faith. The most tangible manifestation of God is Jesus himself. God has been revealed to us through this Jesus. While Jesus was a tangible person, our accepting of him as the manifestation of God requires faith, and this faith is no easier today than it was at the time of Jesus himself. The overriding disposition of these readings is humility. Jesus, the human manifestation of the divine, is meek and humble, and the true disciple is called to be humble. A second disposition is placed before us – grateful praise. In the psalm we praise and bless God; we extol God's holy name. In Jesus we have known the tender touch of God, and we are grateful.

Living the Gospel - Shoulder My Yoke

Jesus invites us to shoulder his yoke and learn from him for he is gentle and humble in heart. The yoke he invites us to shoulder is the deceptively simple teaching: love God and love your neighbour. To love God is to consciously make a place in our lives for God. The busy spin that tends to be characteristic of so many people's lives today does not allow room for God; does not allow room for prayer and quiet; does not allow room for compassionate response to others. To love God and love our neighbour we must first make room for them.

Stage 3 Easing of Restrictions for Queensland

On Tuesday, the Queensland Government announced that Stage 3 of the Roadmap to Easing Restrictions had been moved forward to commence at 12:00pm last Friday 3 July.

Bishop Ken Howell sent out an update on Wednesday of what this means for parishes. For parishes who are following the *Industry COVID Safe Plan for Places of Worship in Queensland,* which includes Our Lady of Graces, there is currently no change at this stage. Therefore, we are allowed to have up to 100 people in Our Lady of Graces Church for Mass, baptisms, funerals and weddings.

As part of the COVID Safe Plan, we need to comply with the following:

- Stay at home if you are vulnerable or unwell.
- Appropriate physical distancing of 1.5 metres.
- Record the contact details of those who attend for contact tracing. These are kept confidentially and securely for 56 days and then destroyed.
- Cleaning protocols after each gathering.

IMPORTANT: Groups & Meetings

Before any group or meeting recommences here at Our Lady of Graces in the Church, Parish Library, Hospitality Area or Aquinas Room, you will need to contact the parish office to discuss if it is possible for you to recommence and the requirements currently in place due to COVID-19.

We want everyone on the same page and following the same procedures.

Temporary Changes due to COVID-19

- Holy water fonts remain empty.
- No passing around of the collection boxes. There are two boxes located inside the church for you to place your offerings.
- The Sign of Peace should be limited to saying "Peace be with you" with a nod or bow; no handshaking or hand-holding should occur here or at the Our Father.
- No Communion on the tongue or from the chalice
- Spread the Word handed out at the end of Mass.

Monday-Saturday Morning Mass Reminders

- The front door is opened 20 minutes prior to each

 Mass
- We have an attendees list of parishioners who regularly attend a certain Daily Mass Time (i.e. 6.30am Mon-Fri, 9am Mon-Fri, and 8am Sat.).
 You only need to advise the parish office once to be included on a particular Mass time list.
- For once off attendance, contact details are collected at the front door as you arrive for Mass.

Private Prayer in the Church

Anyone who wishes to visit the church for private prayer can still do so during parish office hours. Please enter the church via the parish office.


Sacrament of Reconciliation
