'Gardening for the Soul'

The gospel continues on from the parable of the Sower that we heard last week. Divine Wisdom, now present in Jesus, continues to teach those who would listen. If God, the householder, sows only good seed why is it that there are such mixed results? The parable makes two points. Firstly that an enemy is responsible for the weeds, not the householder; secondly that the householder will deal with these weeds at the harvest time.



It is important to read this parable in its context. Jesus is dealing with why so many do not respond to his te aching, for his ministry receives a very mixed response. In the symbolism of the parable, the reign of God that Jesus announces is met by vigorous opposition from the powers of evil. This is the reality in Jesus' time, the reality faced by Matthew's community and it continues to be our reality. The voice of the Gospel continues to struggle to be heard in our present society. Other values are presented as offering a better way of life - if we allow asylum seekers in, our 'white Australian' quality of life may change - if we stop embryonic research we may lose our scientists and possible cures for many illnesses.

With many of the complex issues we face it is not easy to discern the weeds from the wheat. On the two issues named above good people of faith hold different views. The parable seems to suggest that the servants need to live with both the wheat and the weeds and leave the task of judgment to God. Jesus offers this teaching to console and encourage his followers. Their task, as servants, is to sow goodness. The task of destroying evil is God's.

Perhaps an even greater challenge is to realise that the parable speaks about me. The paradox within my own life -1 too have to learn to live with the wheat and the weeds within my own heart. Many years ago I read a story of Tony D'Mello's; it goes something like this. The preacher came and asked the class, 'If all the good people wore white and all the bad people wore black, what would you wear?' Mary Jane answered, 'I'd wear polka dots!' For all our good intentions, and efforts we will probably continue to struggle with some issues all our lives. The garden of our soul will always need a little weeding. These inner struggles will continue to call us to conversion and we will continue to need to call on God and allow God to be the gardener of our souls. Knowing the weeds and wheat within our own individual lives, can help us be a little more patient, or tolerant of the weeds and wheat around us - in our families, communities, our Church. This is not an invitation to complacency but a reminder to 'get real' as young people say.

Sunday Mass at Our Lady of Graces Parish

- Book online via the home page of the parish website <u>www.carinacatholicparish.org.au</u>.
- Parishioners who do not have internet access may phone the parish office on 3398 2977 during office hours to make a booking.
- Registration for Sunday Mass closes each Friday at 12 noon. This allows for the registration lists to be finalised and printed.
- The front door of the church is opened 30 minutes prior to Mass.
- We ask parishioners to book a seat each week for Sunday Mass. Please do not rely on space being available and just turn up at Mass. Registration will ensure that a space is available for you.
- Parishioners may need to be flexible, in that their preferred Mass Time might already be full with 100 people attending. As more parishioners realise that we are celebrating Sunday Mass, attendance may need to be limited to once a fortnight.
- Note: All Catholics remain dispensed from their Sunday obligation until further notice.

Stage 3 COVID-19 Restrictions for Queensland

A reminder that based on the one person per 4 square metres rule, Our Lady of Graces Church can only cater for 100 people with the current restrictions.

Please note that the police are doing spot checks on parishes to make sure everyone is complying with the restrictions. We are aware of one parish in the Northern Suburbs of Brisbane and one parish on the Gold Coast who have had the police visit them.

As part of the COVID Safe Plan, we still need to comply with the following:

- Stay at home if you are vulnerable or unwell.
- Appropriate physical distancing of 1.5 metres.
- Record the contact details of those who attend for contact tracing. These are kept confidentially and securely for 56 days and then destroyed.
- Cleaning protocols after each gathering.

IMPORTANT: Groups & Meetings

Before any group or meeting recommences here at Our Lady of Graces in the Church, Parish Library, Hospitality Area or Aquinas Room, you will need to contact the parish office to discuss if it is possible for you to recommence and the requirements currently in place due to COVID-19.

We want everyone on the same page and following the same procedures.

Sacrament of Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Reconciliation currently is only being celebrated by appointment due to the COVID-19 restrictions. To make an appointment for Reconcilciation, please contact the parish office.

Private Prayer in the Church

The church is open during parish office hours for private prayer. Entry into the church is via the office.

Temporary Changes due to COVID-19

- Holy water fonts remain empty.
- No passing around of the collection boxes. There are two boxes located inside the church for you to place your offerings.
- The Sign of Peace should be limited to saying "Peace be with you" with a nod or bow; no handshaking or hand-holding should occur here or at the Our Father.
- No Communion on the tongue or from the chalice

Monday-Saturday Morning Mass Reminders

- The front door is opened 20 minutes prior to each Mass.
- We have an attendees list of parishioners who regularly attend a certain Daily Mass Time (i.e. 6.30am Mon-Fri, 9am Mon-Fri, and 8am Sat.). You only need to advise the parish office once to be included on a particular Mass time list.
- For once off attendance, contact details are collected at the front door as you arrive for Mass.

Catholic sector welcomes new home care packages

Catholic Health Australia has welcomed the release of a further 6150 home care packages for older Australians and urged the federal



Government to increase the pace so those needing care and support are not missing out.

The Government made the announcement about the extra home care support yesterday and also said it would extend the aged care royal commission by several months. The royal commission was originally due to report by November 12 but will be given until February 26.

CHA Chief Executive Pat Garcia said the waitlist for home care packages - which now stands at around 100,000 - remains unacceptably high, a point highlighted by the Royal Commission into Aged Care Quality and Safety's Interim Report.

With the royal commission now reporting in February, Mr Garcia said all eyes would be on the May 2021 Budget.

"The aged care system is in desperate need of reform and proper funding - it needs an overarching plan that offers stability to the system," he said.

"It is critical that the Government takes the opportunity presented by the royal commission to present a resourced program for systemic reform of aged care services so that all older Australians have timely access to quality aged care and support services of their choice."
