Reflection by Dianne Bergant CSA

Two themes seem to weave through the readings for this Sunday: treasure and delight. The treasure is the extraordinary gift that comes from God; the delight is the joy that we experience when we realise that the treasure is ours. A third theme, which is found in the first reading, picks up a theme that we have considered several times during this period of Ordinary Time, namely, service of others.



The treasure is the kingdom of heaven. It is the prize that gives meaning to the present, and its fullest delight draws us into the future. The reign of God is the fulfilment of our deepest desires and our fondest hopes. Nothing in the world can compare with it, and that is why we are willing to sacrifice everything to attain it. The treasure that we find is really a gift that is given. We need not work to attain the kingdom, nor can we earn it in any way. It is given to us by God. All we have to do is accept it.

Solomon chose to be of service to others. In this he is a model for disciples to follow. We have discovered the treasure in the field; we have found the pearl of great price. What we have been given, we must now give to others. In giving we will lose nothing. In fact, we gain an abundance of blessings. All things work for good, and God is glorified in all. Such is the character of the kingdom of God.

Current COVID-19 Restrictions

Based on the current restrictions of one person per 4 square metres rule, 100 people can gather in Our Lady of Graces Church at one time.

As part of our COVID Safe Plan, we need to comply with the following:

- Stay at home if you are vulnerable or unwell.
- Appropriate physical distancing of 1.5 metres.
- Record the contact details of those who attend for contact tracing. These are kept confidentially and securely for 56 days and then destroyed.
- Cleaning protocols after each gathering.

Sacrament of Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Reconciliation currently is only being celebrated by appointment due to the COVID-19 restrictions. To make an appointment for Reconcilciation, please contact the parish office.

Private Prayer in the Church

The church is open during parish office hours for private prayer. Entry into the church is via the office.

Temporary Changes due to COVID-19

- Holy water fonts remain empty.
- No passing around of the collection boxes. There are two boxes located inside the church for you to place your offerings.
- The Sign of Peace should be limited to saying "Peace be with you" with a nod or bow; no handshaking or hand-holding should occur here or at the Our Father.
- No Communion on the tongue or from the chalice

Monday-Saturday Morning Masses

- The front door is opened 20 minutes before Mass
- We have an attendees list of parishioners who regularly attend a certain Daily Mass Time. To be included on the list, advise the parish office.
- Contact details for once off attendance is collected at the door when you arrive for Mass.

Pope donates ventilator to Brazil hospital

Pope Francis has donated a ventilator to a hospital in Brazil as the medical ship named in his honour is re-tasked to bring medical assistance to



coronavirus-hit communities on the Amazon River.

The Pope donated the ventilator to the Campanha de Marabá Hospital as the number of infections and deaths due to the COVID-19 virus continues to increase in the South American country.

Expressing his gratitude in a video, Bishop Vital Corbellini of Marabá said that "it was a beautiful charitable action of Pope Francis through the Apostolic Nunciature" which will be used to "save as many lives as possible."

"We ask that it be used especially for the Indigenous peoples, because they are the most in need," Bishop Corbellini said.

The respirator, one of four sent by the Holy Father to Brazil, along with a temperature monitor, arrived in Marabá on Sunday. Bishop Corbellini, in turn, presented them to the health facility's coordinator during a small ceremony on Monday.

Meanwhile, the Pope Francis Hospital Ship is delivering medical assistance to Amazon River communities hit with by the coronavirus pandemic.

"This ship has already worked miracles, bringing healing and hope to river populations," said Brother Joel Sousa, a member of the ship's coordination team.

Therefore, he continued, there is even more reason to do so in times of a medical emergency.

The ship has been sailing the Amazon River for a year, delivering medical aid and assistance to some 700,000 members of coastal populations – many of them indigenous communities - in Brazil's Amazon Rainforest.

In an interview published on the Latin American Episcopal Council (CELAM) website, Brother Sousa said the medical and logistical team aboard the ship was reorganised to fight the pandemic.

He said the crew is now committed to raising awareness and providing information to the local populations and offers on-the-spot, first-stage outpatient treatment.

"We are dealing mainly with flu-like symptoms and mild cases of Covid-19," he said, adding that "the doctors carry out the consultations, while we dedicate ourselves to the distribution of medicines."



The initiative was set up and promoted by Bishop Bernardo Bahlmann of Obidos in the northern Brazilian state of Pará, together with the religious of the Fraternity of St Francis

of Assisi in the Providence of God, who run a hospital in Rio de Janeiro.
