Reflection by Greg Sunter

The theme that comes through this week's readings is one of 'being called'. The first reading is the call of the prophet Isaiah (Is 6:1-8). Isaiah experiences a vision of the glory of God and is humbly reminded of his own deficiencies: he believes himself to be 'a man of unclean lips'. As such, he is certainly unfit to speak on behalf of God as his unclean lips would taint whatever message he may speak. But his lips are cleansed by God who then asks, 'Whom shall I send?' Demonstrating a complete conversion of heart and mind, Isaiah immediately replies, 'Here I am, send me!'

This first reading provides a perfect balance to the gospel. Jesus is being closely pressed by the crowd when he asks a nearby fisherman to take him just off shore to preach without being overwhelmed by the crowd. Seemingly at random, he has selected the boat of the fisherman Peter. Having finished preaching for the day, Jesus tells Peter to set out into deeper water and pay out his fishing nets. Peter is certainly not keen on the idea! Out of some interest or good nature he had agreed to allow this preacher to use his boat for a while, but now this country bumpkin is trying to tell him how to fish! Just to prove Jesus wrong, Peter agrees to go through the futile exercise and is overwhelmed by the enormous catch of fish. Like Isaiah in the first reading, Peter is suddenly acutely aware of his own deficiencies - 'Leave me Lord; I am a sinful man'. Like Isaiah, he recognises that he has just seen the glory of God revealed and he feels unworthy to be part of the experience. But Jesus reassures him, 'Do not be afraid,' and calls Peter to follow.

St Vinnies Update - 2019

Thank you to the generous response to the St Vincent de Paul request to include fruit and vege in the Parish food donations at the Church entrance. This is greatly assisting in providing fresh fruit and vege to the many families we visit. Already this year we have assisted 86 children with back to school costs. members of St Vincent de Paul, Our Lady of Graces are passionate about ensuring all children go back to school with the required school uniform and school resources. This is a costly exercise and thanks to an internal donation of the Society State education fund we were able to pay over \$16,000 in back to school costs for these children. You may ask why so much money? It is a great question and every year when I am administering the education grant for the local area I ask myself the same question. Most of the children we visit attend local State Schools so you would think the costs would be minimal.....my observation is it seems to be the complete opposite. These children from low income families are asked to supply stationery items approx. costing \$150.00 per child, uniforms ranging up to \$140 for a prep child (even with second hand uniforms), basic school shoes \$30++ and costly resource levies/technology levies......believe me there is no such thing as a "free education". Without the help of yourselves to assist families with food, and the State Education grant from the Society there is no way these children would be equipped for School. We all know with education and the proper resources to attend school the lives of these children can be changed for ever!!! Please pray for these children that they be inspired by their learning this year and open to the opportunities education provides. Many thanks. Barbara Dougherty St Vinnies President – O.L.G.

Data Projector Operator Training



The liturgy if the word is a decisive element in the celebration of each one of the sacraments of the Church; in pastoral practise however, the faithful are not always conscious of this connection, nor do they appreciate the unity between gesture and word...

The relationship between word and sacramental gesture is the liturgical expression of God's activity in the history of salvation through the performative character of the word itself. In salvation history there is no separation between what God says and what he does. His word appears as alive and active (Heb 4:12), as the Hebrew term dabar itself makes clear. In the liturgical action too, encounter hís word accomplishes what is says. By educating the People of God to discover the performative character of God's word in the liturgy, we will help them to recognise his activity in salvation history and their individual lives.
