Reflection by Greg Sunter



Today's gospel is one of the stories unique to the gospel of Luke. At the same time, it is a commonly known story that is often cited to demonstrate the value of saying thank you. However, as usual, there's more to this story than initially meets the eye. One of the recurrent themes of the gospel is at play here: the message of salvation that Jesus brings is available to all, not just the Jews.

The first reading is an interesting link with the gospel of Luke. In chapter 4 of the gospel, when Jesus visits Nazareth and preaches in the synagogue, he later tells a story about the prophets Elijah and Elisha responding to the needs of Gentiles rather than Jews. He tells the story to make the point that the message of salvation is not reserved exclusively for the Jews. The incident involving Elisha that Jesus refers to in chapter 4 is the one we hear in today's first reading.

Whilst both the first reading and the gospel tell stories about the healing of those with skin diseases, the common factor is actually about their expressions of gratitude and conversion of heart. In the gospel, all ten men are healed but it is only the stranger; the foreigner; the Samaritan, who comes back to give thanks and to praise God. The others – Jewish men, presumably – are only concerned about themselves and have no time to acknowledge the graciousness of God that they have experienced. The gospel writer has Jesus emphasise the point that it is the Samaritan – the outsider – who has recognised God's activity in his cure and come back to give praise and thanks. It is only he who has experienced the change of heart; the conversion of faith.

THINKING AHEAD

29th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The readings for next week give us guidance in our approach to prayer, citing the importance of patience, persistence and trust in God.

When our prayers aren't answered in a short time, we can become despondent and feel God isn't listening. If we recall St Monica's life, her prayers for her wayward son, Augustine, seemed for many years to go unanswered, but she persisted. Her prayers required more than offering up words to God. They required a demonstration of faith, played out through her life and actions. Monica had to trust that God knew all she felt and that her prayers would be answered. She needed to be patient with both God and Augustine while she waited. While the wait was long, Augustine not only became a member of God's faith family, but rose to be one of its Bishops and Saints.

Prayer is connected to relationships of faith and love. We pray to the one who loves us, for those we love. As in all relationships, patience and persistence is required. In the waiting period, prayer signifies our faith; that God hears, that he knows and will answer our prayers. Whatever his response, he will be there for us.
