# Spread the Word

#### Reflection by Greg Sunter



In the gospel of Luke, widows represent the lowly of society. They also are a measure of how the society is travelling. In the Old Testament, God commanded the people to care for widows, orphans and strangers. Widows, in particular, were to be cared for by the whole community. From that point on, the level of compassion within the society could be measured by the care extended to the widows. A number of the prophets

point to neglect of the widows as a sign that the community has turned its back on the covenant with God. The gospel of Luke picks up this prophetic tradition and on several occasions uses widows as the key figures in stories or parables.

In this parable, the widow is petitioning her local judge for justice against towards the widow, but the judge fobs her off repeatedly. The widow, knowing that her cause is just, persists and finally wears down the judge.

Another feature of the gospel of Luke is that the lowly and poor – represented here by the widow – are those who recognise their own condition and call on the mercy of God to lift them up. Jesus says that God will see justice done to those who cry out for God's help. Jesus' final comment about finding any faith on earth is a reminder that human beings have a tendency to think they can solve all their own problems and forget that they need God's action in their lives. The faithful in the gospel of Luke are those who know that they are in need of God's mercy and love and call out for it.

#### Important - Planned Giving Program

In 1974 and in the years to follow, the parishioners of Our Lady of Graces gifted this church to the generations that followed. In the 45 years since, we have all worshipped, enjoyed and benefitted by their sacrifice. Sacrifice, because time then were no less difficult than they are today and many made significant commitments both in time



and money to create this wonderful building. An example to us of true sacrificial giving.

It may not be obvious, but minor maintenance of our church building is being carried out regularly but as with all buildings, time takes its toll. It has now come to the point where serious and expensive maintenance needs to be addressed, for example: some big ticket items include the roof, the carpet together with internal and external painting. The work required on these is not optional, the longer we leave them, the more expensive they will be to remedy.

So how in these present difficult times when mass attendance is dropping and the cost of everything seems to be rising are we to finance this much needed work?

One way, with an organisation as large as this Parish, is to administer its finances by drawing up annual budgets and just importantly, adhering to that budget. When the Parish budgets are produced in October/November each year, they are based on expected income and expenses. Planned Giving promises are the major part of that expectation.

There is another way out Parish Finances can be helped and in addition saved you chasing around for spare notes or change on a Sunday morning. Moreover, it won't cost any extra to you current promised contribution. Simply move your giving pattern from 'cash on the plate' or the 'envelope system' to an electronic transaction – either by card or direct debit. It is completely safe and many parishioners already contribute in this way.

You need not be concerned about not having anything to put on the plate as there are cards available at the church entrance and may be used in lieu of an envelope and money.
