Gospel Reflection by Greg Sunter



Today marks the final Sunday of Ordinary Time in the Church's liturgical calendar and draws us almost to the end of our journey through the Gospel of Luke. Next week's reading of the crucifixion concludes the Year of Luke. It is in this context that we need to read today's Gospel passage. Jesus and his disciples are gathered around the Temple in Jerusalem in the final days

before he is to be put to death. The end is imminent and Jesus takes the opportunity to reassure the disciples that, although they are about to experience a period of distress, betrayal and persecution that will stretch well into the future, ultimately, God's love and mercy will triumph – not only in their own lives but also in the world.

The language of passages like today's Gospel can be off-putting at times and can also be seized upon by those who would interpret scripture literally. The graphic descriptions certainly lend themselves to predictions of gloom and doom. However, we must also remember that the Gospel was written some 50 or more years after the death of Jesus. At the time of writing, many of these things had already come to pass. The message for the community who were suffering through these very experiences is that they should not despair because all of this was anticipated by Jesus and that ultimately the reign of God will come about and the effort and distress that they have endured will be vindicated.

Unfortunately, the lectionary has the passage concluding at verse 19; the complete passage continues on for another 17 verses and so we don't get the full effect of Jesus' speech. In the latter portion, Jesus assures the disciples that the kingdom will surely come to pass. It is a promise that we affirm every time we say the Creed.

Planned Giving Program

In 1974 and in the years to follow, the parishioners of Our Lady of Graces gifted this church to the generations that followed. In the 45 years since, we have all worshipped, enjoyed and benefitted by their sacrifice. Sacrifice, because times then were no less difficult than they are today and many made significant commitments both in time and money to create this wonderful building. An example to us of true sacrificial giving.

It may not be obvious, but minor maintenance of our church building is being carried out regularly but as with all buildings, time takes its toll. It has now come to the point where serious and expensive maintenance needs to be addressed, for example: some big ticket items include the roof, the carpet together with internal and external painting. The work required on these is not optional, the longer we leave them, the more expensive they will be to remedy.

So how, in these present difficult times when mass attendance is dropping and the cost of everything seems to be rising, are we to finance this much needed work?

One way, with an organisation as large as this Parish, is to administer its finances by drawing up annual budgets and just as importantly, adhering to that budget. When the Parish budgets are produced in October/November each year, they are based on expected income and expenses. Planned Giving promises are the major part of that expectation.

There is another way out Parish Finances can be helped and in addition save you chasing around for spare notes or change on a Sunday morning. Moreover, it won't cost any extra to you current promised contribution. Simply move your giving pattern from 'cash on the plate' or the 'envelope system' to an electronic transaction – either by card or direct debit. It is completely safe and many parishioners already contribute in this way.

You need not be concerned about not having anything to put on the plate as there are cards available at the church entrance and may be used in lieu of an envelope and money.
