The Hour and the Time

Israel was often portrayed as a bride in Jewish scriptures. So, the question was: 'When would the Bridegroom – the Anointed One of God, the Christ – appear?' Jesus' warning is to the attendants of the bride: 'Be alert, be vigilant, be prepared.' *Some* (the five foolish attendants) did miss the moment: the earthly ministry of Jesus of Nazareth.



But his warning is also for the Catholic Church which is the new Bride of Christ. We are the attendants to the Bride and the imperative applies to us also: Be alert, be vigilant. Be prepared for the eruption, the intervention of Our Lord Jesus Christ, the Bridegroom, into *our* history, into *our* moment of time.

For example, is Christ coming to meet us in the modern movements which demand to hold authority accountable, or which press for just recognition of women? We can foolishly remain in the dark or we can wisely try to throw light on these questions. Only then we will be able to discern whether indeed it is the Lord who is approaching.

We could pause to pray that we be ready when the Bridegroom responds to the ancient prayer: 'Come, Lord Jesus!'



Philippines hit by second typhoon in a week

Caritas Australia's partners are monitoring the effect of Super Typhoon Goni which has struck the Philippines and will soon hit Vietnam, one week after Typhoon Quinta struck both countries.

Super Typhoon Goni hit the eastern island province of Catanduanes on Sunday. The storm moved through heavily populated regions including the main island of Luzon, causing at least 10 deaths and leaving three people missing. It is expected to hit Vietnam tomorrow.

More than 390,000 people in the Philippines have fled their homes, including more than 345,000 people to evacuation centres, raising concerns about further spreading COVID-19. The Philippines has had more than 383,000 cases of coronavirus and currently has more than 27,000 active cases.

Caritas Philippines is monitoring the progress of Typhoon Goni and is working with local church organisations to respond. At this stage, challenges include infrastructure damage and shelter.

Due to the impact of COVID-19, support will be channelled through Caritas Australia's Church and NGO partners in the Philippines.

Caritas Philippines national director Bishop Colin Bagaforo said: "The typhoon will surely bring greater poverty to our communities, as they have also been battling against the effects of COVID-19. So with humility, we appeal for everyone's sincere acts of kindness, generosity and compassion."
