Reflection by Greg Sunter

The radical teaching that was begun in last week's gospel as the beatitudes and woes is continued in this week's challenge to be forgiving, compassionate and generous in the same way that God expresses abundant love. As with the blessings and curses of the Beatitudes passage, this teaching continues the challenge to act against cultural and social expectations. Who would be surprised if you were to express hatred for an enemy or for someone who hates you or treats you badly? But Jesus tells his disciples to *love* their enemies and to *do good* to those who hate them. His instruction is contrary to the 'normal' way of doing things – and that's exactly the message Jesus wanted to convey! Rather than a spiteful, vengeful God who keeps score and punishes wrongdoing, Jesus presents a compelling image of a God of unbounded compassion and abundant generosity.

In this passage we find one version of the Golden Rule that appears repeatedly throughout the gospels (as well as most other religious traditions): 'Treat others as you would like them to treat you.' It is followed up with a comment that it takes no effort to treat well people whom you like – anybody can do that. The challenge is to treat people you don't like as you would like to be treated yourself. In a society that had very strict rules about the way to treat different people and clearly established boundaries between different groups, this was a tough ask by Jesus. Bear in mind also that there was an occupying army in the country and Jesus was encouraging the people to treat even their enemies, the Romans, with love, compassion and forgiveness. This was a radical and challenging teaching!

Following requests from parishioners, we will now be holding an **evening Ash Wednesday Mass at 7pm** in addition to the 6.30am and 9am masses on Wednesday 6 March. This will allow those in the workforce to attend the Ash Wednesday Mass.

The season of Lent is the most appropriate time for celebrating the sacrament of penance.

Already on Ash Wednesday the people of God has heard the solemn invitation, *Turn away from sin and believe the good news*. It is therefore fitting to have several penitential celebrations during Lent, so that all the faithful may have an opportunity to be reconciled with God and their neighbour and so be able to celebrate the paschal mystery in the Easter Triduum with renewed hearts.

The sacrament of Penance is better celebrated *before* rather than during the Easter Triduum.

Revenue items: The Collections & Giving Budget was set before the Planned Giving Program that was conducted in May 2018, with effect from July 2018, was held. The increase in giving has been comforting for the Parish, supportive of the need for maintenance of our Parish assets. As advised during the Campaign, there are significant costs ahead - particularly in regards the buildings roofing.

Expenditure Items: Whilst a number of the Ministries have been conducted at lower cost than was originally budgeted, we acknowledge the risk that reduced cost may reflect reduced outreach by our Parish.

Comment on Outlook: Whilst the finish of the 2018 year was encouraging compared with the Budget for that period, the Finance Council has noted that Pledges made during the Planned Giving Campaign in May 2018 are not being fulfilled and this is impacting on the Parish plans for building maintenance.
