The wilderness, or desert, is used repeatedly throughout the Bible as a place of special encounter with God and preparation for a new direction or a new ministry. The 40 days that Jesus spent in the wilderness immediately followed his baptism in the Jordan where his status as the beloved of God was confirmed. He is led by the Spirit to go out into the wilderness for a period of fasting, prayer and preparation before entering into his public ministry. In fact, the event that immediately follows this passage is the episode in Nazareth where Jesus reads from the scroll of Isaiah and declares the intent of his ministry. It is presented as if, having spent his time in preparation and overcoming the temptations before him, Jesus strode out of the wilderness and laid out what he had decided.

The episode of the temptations is a clear indicator of the humanity of Jesus - he experienced doubt, uncertainty and fear just as we do. If the gospel intended to emphasise the divinity of Jesus, none of these temptations would have been an issue. We are told that Jesus was indeed tempted, not just pestered by the devil. The opportunities laid before Jesus were actually tempting to him. They challenged his resolve. They made Jesus question the sort of Messiah that he was to be: the all-conquering, powerful Messiah that the people expected; or the servant to the poor who will be tortured and put to death. Jesus is tempted to use his power to make his task easier or to display his authority to others. Had he chosen to do this, surely it would have been easier to get people's attention – and that was the temptation: to take the easier path or stick to the more subtle, more personal, more difficult path.

LENT

The seasons of Lent and Easter are rich in Catholic symbolism. We begin the season of Lent with the receiving of ashes on our foreheads as a sign of

repentance and turning back to God. The ashes themselves impart nothing to us, but point to the meaning of the season in which we are entering. During the season of Lent in this parish, we do not have a recessional hymn, but rather depart in silence with a sense of recollection. A large cross has been placed in the sanctuary dressed in purple, again of themselves, simply pieces of wood and fabric, but in our catholic minds the sign of our victory over death and a sign of gods out pouring of love for us.

Around the church, we have placed images of the way of the cross, along tradition church of accompanying Jesus on his way to Calvary. The stations, started by St Francis of Assisi, were a way for people who could not make the arduous pilgrimage to Jerusalem, to participate in the way of the cross. The tradition has grown up of making the stations on Friday's and especially of those of Lent to remind us of that love that God has for us in the suffering death and resurrection of Jesus.

Stations of the Cross

Stations of the Cross will be held every Friday of Lent starting at 7pm and will continue through to Good Friday. All are welcome to attend.

Palm Fronds and Cyprus Pine branches – Palm Sunday

- 1. Fast from hurting words; say kind words.
- 2. Fast from sadness; be filled with gratitude.
- 3. Fast from anger; be filled with patience.
- 4. Fast from pessimism; be filled with hope.
- 5. Fast from worries; trust in God.
- 6. Fast from complaints; contemplate simplicity.
- 7. Fast from pressures; be prayerful.
- 8. Fast from bitterness; fill you heart with joy.
- 9. Fast from selfishness; be compassionate to others.
- 10. Fast from grudges; be reconciled. Fast from words; be silent so you can listen.


Immersion Experience
