Reflection by Greg Sunter



Today's gospel is perhaps the most famous of the parables that are unique to the Gospel of Luke. Sadly, what is often overlooked is the accusation aimed at Jesus that leads into the telling of this and two other shorter parables (the Lost Sheep and the Lost Coin – Lk 15:4-10). The Pharisees and scribes accuse Jesus of

what they regard to be abhorrent behaviour in relation to the purity code that dominated 1st Century life: not only does Jesus welcome sinners, he actually shares meals with them. This would be absolutely scandalous behaviour. Who you ate with was a reflection of who you were. To eat with sinners and the unclean effectively made you a sinner and unclean.

The three parables Jesus tells in response to this accusation are all about the lost being found and great rejoicing over the finding of the lost sheep, lost coin, or lost son. The Gospel of Luke – more so than any of the others has a very strong focus on the message of Jesus being addressed to and welcomed by the outcasts and marginalised; in other words, the 'lost' of his society. Rather than being embarrassed by the accusation that he ate with sinners, Jesus would have worn those words like a badge of honour. It was exactly what his mission and ministry was all about - being one with the poor; the outcast; the sinful; the lost. The three parables, and particularly the parable of the lost son, demonstrate the joy of a loving God when one who was lost returns. The extravagant welcome the prodigal son receives from his father is symbolic of the extravagance of God's love that will be poured out for any 'sinner' who returns to God.

Easter, Easter Bunnies and Easter Eggs



The name Easter has its origin with a goddess of the Anglo-Saxons named Eostre. It is believed that she is the goddess of the dawn

and was worshipped in the spring by pagans in Northern Europe and the British Isles. But where did all the bunnies and eggs come from and what do they have to do with Easter? It's a question that many have asked so here we go.

Let's start with the rabbits, or, to be more accurate, the hares. In ancient times, it was believed (as by Pliny, Plutarch, Philostratus, and Aelian) that the hare was a hermaphrodite. The idea that a hare could reproduce without loss of virginity led to an association with the Virgin Mary, with hares sometimes occurring in illuminated manuscripts and Northern European paintings of the Virgin and Christ Child. Among German Lutherans, the "Easter Hare" originally played the role of a judge, evaluating whether children were good or disobedient in behaviour at the start of the season of Eastertide [much like Santa Klaus at Christmas]. The idea of the Easter Hare bringing the eggs dates back to about 1682.

And why eggs? Orthodox churches have a custom of abstaining from eggs during the fast of Lent. The only way to keep them from being wasted was to boil or roast them, and begin eating them to break the fast. As a special dish, they were decorated as part of the celebrations. Many Christians of the Eastern Orthodox Church to this day typically dye their Easter eggs red, the colour of blood, in recognition of the blood of the sacrificed Christ (and, of the renewal of life in springtime). Some also use the colour green, in honour of the new foliage emerging after the long-dead time of winter.

So the bunny and eggs aren't, in fact, adaptations of earlier pagan practices as the name Easter is, but rather medieval European Christian practices that have come down to us and has been commercialised and flourishes to this day.

- For those who wish to do the full First Aid course (CPR included) this will run from 8am through to 5pm. The total cost of the full course is \$99.


